Objective:

TSWBAT write the titles of books, magazines, songs, plays, and other works.

Rules for Titles of Works:

Capitalize the first, last, and each important word in the title of a book magazine, or newspaper.

Underline or put in italics the titles of books, magazines, plays, movies, television shows, or newspapers.

Put quotation marks around the titles of short stories, essays, articles, songs, poems, and chapters in a book.

Capitalize	title of books, magazines, or newspapers
<u>underline</u> or <i>italicize</i>	titles of books, magazines, plays, movies, television shows, or newspapers
"quotation marks"	short stories, essays, articles, songs, poems, chapters in a book
