

Objective: TSWBAT identify and use compound predicates

RULES

- These sentences can be combined by joining the predicates to make a **compound predicate**. Use the words *and*, *but* or *or*.

Tad will sing in the talent show. Tad will dance in the talent show.

Tad will sing and dance in the school talent show.

Combine the predicates of each sentence pair. Write the new sentence.

1. Sally will play the piano. Sally will sing.

Sally will sing and play the piano.

2. Kamir will whistle. Kamir will dance.

Kamir will whistle and dance.

3. Marla will recite poems. Marla will tell jokes.

Marla will recite poems and tell jokes.

4. Abdul will juggle. Abdul will perform magic tricks.

Abdul will juggle and perform magic tricks.

5. The performers will rehearse. The performers will work hard.

The performers will rehearse and work hard.

6. The director worried. The director complained.

The director worried and complained.

7. The talent show could succeed. The talent show could flop.

The talent show could succeed or flop.

8. The audience might applaud. The audience might boo.

The audience might applaud or boo.

9. The first act amazed everyone. The first act delighted everyone.

The first act amazed and delighted everyone.

10. The crowd cheered. The crowd clapped.

The crowd cheered and clapped.
